A huge thank you to all the parents that help out on Junior Night every Friday, preparing exceptionally good home cooked food with all profits coming back to the club! This has generated over £3,000 since this time last year in just food profit alone! Outstanding efforts!

The bar is seeing very healthy profits every Friday too, which has greatly helped the profit increase for the club overall. An average amount taken each Friday is over £300 (sometimes over £450) Thanks to Eric who has worked the 'Friday night early shift' voluntary for many years and is rushed off his feet these days! Paul Rock and the Coaching Liaison Committee have re-organised the weekly Junior Tennis Programme so that we now run a 'Club Programme' rather than each coach working independently. This is coming in to fruition at the start of the summer term and we are sure that the children will be able to improve their tennis in a much more structured way. We also aim to ensure that every child gets to know all the coaches and all children will be given equal opportunities to play team tennis if they wish to.

We were very sad to say goodbye to Ian who was with the club for over 7 years and wish him well in his new venture. Ian has promised to join as a player and so we will still see him around! Thanks to all the parents who have helped get teams out on time in both the Winter and Aegon teams this year. The SummerLeague is about to start and all help is as usual always welcome! Paul Rock has continued to show extraordinary efforts and commitment to the Junior Section ensuring that all children whatever their ability or age enjoy tennis at the club. The number of older children playing at the club is growing each week and with the assistance of Raf, who you may have seen around the club helping Paul on a Friday night, has greatly increased the number of kids coming down for drills. Every court is used now each Friday from 4pm-9pm, which is very pleasing to see! Paul has also instigated invited adult players to join in the older drills sessions ensuring that the juniors who are ready to play in with the adult sections get to know some of us to make that transition easier. I was so impressed with the level of play and slightly concerned as I'm sure the kids will beat many of us very soon!

It's a real buzz for me to see so many people enjoying the club of all ages and so many people volunteering their time to help in all the various aspects of running such a large, strong section of the club!

CLUBHOUSE MANAGER/MAINTENANCE

The bar rota continues to work well and again a huge thank you to everyone who helps out. This is saving the club \pounds 4,400 a year. The club continues to be a buzzy, friendly place to be and with lots of new members joining and offering their help we should see many years of stability ahead.

We would also like to take this opportunity to reiterate to members that rules are proposed by the members and voted in by the members at the AGM. The Committee is just a group of people who try and enforce this as best as they can.

CLUBMARK Update

Clubmark was introduced by Sport England in 2002 and is currently being implemented across 34 sports. The LTA administers its own version of Clubmark based on the National guidelines and now has over 800 accredited clubs. The objective is to ensure that clubs operate a quality tennis "programme" and covers four areas: Operational Structure, Policies and Procedures, Coaching and Planning for future development and improvements. All this is currently documented in the Clubmark Binder and will shortly be available through the club Website. N&C was first accredited two years ago and undertakes a major annual review of the documents with the Herts LTA.
